Keeping children safe at home.

Intensive in-home services is a 4-6 week crisis intervention program for families whose children are at immediate risk (within 72 hours) of being separated due to mental illness, emotional disturbances, substance abuse, juvenile delinquency, family violence, abuse, or neglect.

Our team spends **8-10 hours per week** minimum with the family **in the home** to help families improve functioning and safety so they may remain together.

Bringing children safely home.

Intensive family reunification services is an 8-12 week program for families whose child has been removed from the home due to safety concerns.

Our team attends Family Support Team meetings and spends a **minimum** of 8-10 hours per week with the family to build on family strengths, address areas of concern, create transition plans, and support the family during the child's safe transition home.

FAMILIES IN BOTH PROGRAMS RECEIVE:

- Strengths-based, family-focused teams certified in trauma-informed care who are available 24/7.
- Individually customized interventions.
- Help to improve problem-solving, parenting, budgeting, household/school management, communication, coping, and other skills.
- Connections to community resources.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Families have been referred by a Missouri Children's Division office.
- Families live in the 48 counties we serve.

Additional Intensive Family Reunification Services (IFRS) Requirements:

- The safety concerns that brought the child into care have been resolved.
- The child has had regular contact with the family and is willing to participate.
 - Family Court agrees the child may return home with IFRS.
