WHAT ARE ADULT GUARDIANS?

Adult Guardians are just everyday volunteers filling an important role for adults who need help making decisions for themselves.

In cases where a court has determined the adult is not able to make legal decisions, they need someone to advocate for them. That's where the guardian comes into play!



• Become familiar with the ward and maintain regular, ongoing contact.

Advocate for the ward by recognizing when their needs are not being met.

 Understand and factor in the ward's perspective on important decisions.

• Sign legal documents for the ward such as Social Security, residential facilities, medical needs, etc..

Provide an annual update for the court.

ADULT GUARDIANS ARE NOT:

- The ward's financial steward.
- A direct support for the everyday needs of the ward.
- The ward's placement, residence, or home.
- A caregiver for the ward.
