



Following a Strategic Path To The Future

In 2024, Cornerstones of Care launched the first year of a new strategic plan by planting the seeds of supporting children and families through innovative means and exploring diverse funding opportunities to provide care.

Last year began with the reopening of our renovated Path House, which provides supervised living for teenagers as they transition from foster care, while our Build Trybe program received a grant from the Environmental Protection Agency to provide marketable skills for youth interested in conservation. The year ended by securing an \$8 million

grant to provide mental and behavioral health services at five Kansas City metropolitian area early childhood education centers. The grant, provided through the Anchors of Tomorrow Fund, creates an opportunity for us to lean into our mission of prevention and support families as they work through trauma at the earliest possible stages.

As part of our trauma-informed care, Cornerstones of Care adheres to seven key commitments, including social responsibility. It is defined as a nurturing, safe, and caring community fostering shared responsibility in decision-making, problem-solving, and conflict resolution. Each of the three instances I mentioned above requires collaboration from partners working at a high level to accomplish big goals.

The work at the early childhood education centers is just beginning through the fund started by the Hall Family Foundation. The project provides therapy and other supports to children, families, and caregivers at the sites. We will work closely with the University of Missouri-Kansas City, which is tracking project results, and coordinating training opportunities with MidAmerica Nazarene University for those working in child education and welfare.

One of the goals of this project is to ensure that children are ready for kindergarten. We are pleased that behavioral and mental health are valued as an important part of school readiness. When children feel safe and healthy, they have a greater opportunity to learn.

The Path House project required community partners, our board members, and forprofit support to renovate our Midtown house to provide living space for up to 10 youth who are learning to live independently as they become adults. It truly took a village to upgrade the aging house and make it a home for our youth.

Build Trybe continues to teach marketable skills in building, culinary, and conservation trades. Last year's support from the EPA was compounded by additional funding from the Missouri Department of Conservation, and the project was enhanced through our relationship with the Heartland Conservation Alliance. Through their support, we are working with our youth, who are beginning to appreciate nature and looking forward to careers to preserving wildlife spaces.

As we enter the second year of our strategic plan, we will continue to find innovative ways to support children and families, identify unique funding opportunities to build support, and partner to build safer, healthier communities.









Early Childhood Project Begins at Five Centers

ornerstones of Care is hiring a few remaining staff positions to lead the Early Childhood Mental Health Collective, a project that addresses the growing community need for mental health services in early childhood settings.

The project is funded through an \$8 million grant from the Anchors of Tomorrow Fund to provide mental and behavioral health services to children and families at five early education centers on both sides of the state line in metropolitan Kansas City. The goal is to build the critical connection between strong mental health and kindergarten readiness, offering supports for both children and their caregivers.

The three-year grant is from the fund established by the Hall Family Foundation. Through the grant, Cornerstones of Care will provide mental, emotional, and behavioral health services at each early childhood center for children at the site, their parents, and caregivers.

Team members are getting to know staff at five early childhood centers: El Centro, Emmanuel, EarlystART, Educare, and Operation Breakthrough. The team members, including some who are bilingual in English and Spanish, will also spend time in classrooms building relationships.

"The work funded through this grant leans into our focus on prevention and providing trauma-informed care before things become too overwhelming," said Cornerstones of Care President and CEO Merideth Rose.

"This is exactly the work Cornerstones of Care wants to do in support of children and families, and to build a safer, healthier community in metropolitan Kansas City."

As part of the project, early childhood program staff will be trained to identify conditions that optimize or weaken early infant and young child brain development and to recognize conditions that require the assistance of parents and service providers.

Cornerstones of Care will collaborate with the University of Missouri-Kansas City to provide interns and apprentices, technical assistance and support, coaching, evaluation, and endorsements from the UMKC Institute for Human Development.

Cornerstones of Care also will partner with MidAmerica Nazarene University to train a cohort of mental health care providers in play therapy and provide required supervision and certification for Registered Play Therapists. MidAmerica Nazarene University agreed to create the training program for bachelor's level mental health care providers to grow in their profession.

The Seed-to-Plate program provides youth marketable skills in the culinary industry and highlights basic cooking skills and healthy habits. Youth in the program gain an understanding of how the food we grow becomes the food we eat.
