





A Summer of Conversations Focused on Community Connection and Support

As part of a busy summer, members of our Executive Leadership Team have connected with a variety of elected officials in both Missouri and Kansas in our constant effort to educate those in positions of power about our work and the vital need for support from all levels of government.

In August, we were honored to host Sen. Patty Lewis (MO-7) and Sen. Maggie Nurrenbern (MO-17) at our Ozanam Campus for a briefing and quick tour. In those meetings, we were able to discuss our work and some of the challenges we face, including increasing costs for services, deferred maintenance, and, of course, our renovation needs for the new Cornerstones of Care Education Campus.

As a promising follow-up from our meetings with the Senators, we are working with Missouri Children's Division to obtain the remaining Family First Prevention Services Act (FFPSA) transition dollars. Children's Division has agreed to expand Intensive In-Home Services (IIS) aimed at keeping families together and out of foster care. Although the amount isn't final, we expect a minimum of \$470,000 to bolster our growing in-home services program.

In Kansas, we were pleased to provide information to Representative Tim Johnson (KS-38) who penned an opinion editorial for the Leavenworth Times about the need for more social workers in the state. We work with area colleges and universities to provide meaningful field experiences for social work students. Ultimately, we hope to increase the number of social workers in the state and encourage many of them to choose to join us at Cornerstones of Care. Representative Johnson will be filing a bill in the 2026 legislative session to provide funding for stipends to social work students who agree to work in under-resourced communities across the state after graduation. We applaud his vision and look forward to supporting this piece of important legislation.

Finally, I had the privilege to testify in June before the Jackson County Legislature to urge them to adopt the county's budget for 2025. Upon passage of the budget, Cornerstones of Care will now receive its allocated funding to help children and families

preempt the onset of drug use or interrupt a potential cycle of substance abuse for adolescents. In addition, Cornerstones of Care was recently awarded a \$50,000 grant for our Jackson County Pathways youth to help with apartment set-up, utilities, rent assistance, and their Build Trybe wages.

Admittedly, some of our work can be confusing to those who aren't involved in it every day, and we are delighted to tell our story. Our investment of time and energy in this outreach may not immediately prove fruitful, but we are committed to building our relationships with elected officials, government entities, community partners, and others who support our work.

Many of these achievements would not be possible without the support of many of you, and we thank you for your ongoing faith in our work with children and families.



Interested in Becoming a Foster Parent? Our Presentation Will Help

s part of a year-long campaign to attract more individuals and families to become foster parents. Cornerstones of Care is taking the message directly to the people.

We are offering a free, noobligation presentation to businesses, organizations, faith-based groups, and others to help them better understand the foster care process and requirements necessary to become a foster parent. Approximately 18,000 youth are in foster care in Kansas and Missouri. Even though that number has been reduced in recent years, neither state has enough foster families for the children in state care.

"We talk about foster parenting as being 'the challenge you won't regret,"" said Cornerstones of Care President and CEO Merideth Rose. "The first step in the process is to learn and have a conversation with our team to better understand how



impactful foster parenting is for both the child and the foster parent."

The 30-minute presentation will share information on how children come into foster care, the licensing process, some of the resources available to foster parents, and dispels a few myths about foster parenting. "The first step in the process is learning and understanding about foster care," said Cornerstones of Care's **Executive Director of Programs** and Services Shelia Rancatore. "Some of the people we will speak to will come away with a different understanding of foster care and the work we do in general."

Cornerstones of Care Education Campus to Open Beginning of 2026 School Year

eginning in August 2026, we will consolidate both of our day treatment schools into a single South Kansas City location.

The consolidation of the K-8 school at the Gillis Campus and the grades 9-12 school at the Ozanam Campus will create the Cornerstones of Care Education Campus at the former Bishop O'Hara High School at 9001 James A. Reed Road. The move will provide additional space to manage larger enrollments and add students who are currently on waiting lists.

"Growth and change are part of Cornerstones of Care's core values as a trauma-informed organization," said President and CEO Merideth Rose. "This was a tremendous opportunity to align our schools and key education programs within the same location."

The new Education Campus is part of a 10-year lease with the James A. Reed Road

property. In addition to the day treatment school classrooms, the Education Campus will include therapeutic services and provide additional space for thriving educational programs like Build Trybe, Behavioral Intervention Support Team (BIST), and Collaborative Learning.

Build Trybe, which teaches marketable job skills to youth in our care, will enhance its outdoor education center with a five-acre space to teach youth in its Landscaping and Conservation and Seed-to-Plate programs.

BIST, which provides training to educational professionals to support youth with behavioral issues and increase learning time within the classroom, will move its offices to the new education center.

The Collaborative Learning and Training team will implement plans for a simulation lab. complete with a realistic home setting to train case managers, foster parents, and biological parents about best practices

in serving children and families working through trauma.

Along with the K-8 school's departure from the Gillis Campus, all team members with on-site offices will move to the Ozanam Campus when the Gillis Campus lease ends in December 2026.

The timing of the move coincided with the expiration of the lease at the Gillis Campus, the availability of the O'Hara High School site, and the prospect of costly deferred maintenance at Gillis.

The agency is currently raising \$1.4 million to support renovations and facility enhancements to the education campus in preparation of the 2026-27 school year.

"Cornerstones of Care's roots go back to the Gillis Campus, and while we feel nostalgia as our time ends there, we see a tremendous opportunity with our new education campus." Meridith said.
